LEADERSHIP

Then, once understood, you can pass that understanding down to your team. Leaders in any chain of command will not always agree. But at the end of the day, once the debate on a particular course of action is over and the boss has made a decision – even if that decision is one you argued against – you must execute the plan as if it were your own."


What does this mean for me and for us as Athletic Administrators?

- 1. *I am in control!* I control how I handle every decision that is made by others. How I process and relay those decisions to our coaches, players, parents, and teams is up to me. I must first understand why decisions were made so that I can properly communicate with others.
- 2. *I will lead up the chain!* I have the ability to lead up the chain by making sure that I communicate what I would like done and to communicate what our best practices are. Trust is something earned, not given. If I want others to trust me, I must show that I am trustworthy to carry out the plans of my school district, the IHSAA, and the NFHS. As I do this, my actions will carry weight with those who have entrusted me to be the athletic administrator. And that trust will give me more power as I advocate for our student-athletes and coaches.

I am reminded daily that I LOVE being an athletic administrator. I appreciate the dedication and hard work that our coaches put into teaching young athletes. I value the character I see in our student-athletes as they strive to improve daily by being better people and better athletes (PCA model). It is with these people that I put my trust to make our world a better place today and into the future.

2021 NIAAA Scholarship

2021 National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association Scholar/Essay Application

The Idaho Athletic Administrator Association is proud to be part of the NIAAA scholarship program. The deadline for the scholarship application is February 28, 2021. This scholarship is open to any Idaho high school senior who meets the following criteria:

- 1. Applicant must be a Senior
- 2. Applicant must have achieved at least one (1) of the following: (A)minimum of B+ average; (B)Ranked in the top 25% of class; (C)ACT score of 24 or an SAT score of 1100 (Math and Reading)
- 3. Applicant must have participated in two sports for at least two years in each sport
- 4. Applicant must have earned at least one varsity letter in each of two sports
- 5. Applicant must complete attached scholar/essay application
- 6. Applicant must have a letter of recommendation from the high school athletic administrator/director 7. School athletic director must be an NIAAA member and a member of their respective state athletic administrators' association
- 8. The principal or athletic director must sign the application to insure that the academic information submitted is accurate
- 9. All hard copy materials must be postmarked or electronic materials sent to the NIAAA State Liaison in your respective state by your states deadline. Select your state at the bottom of the website Scholarship Page to view your states deadline and liaison information.

The IAAA will select a male and female winner and the winners will receive a \$500.00 scholarship, a plaque and be recognized at the IAAA state conference.

One of the goals of the NIAAA is to promote professional and personal growth of athletic administrators. Leadership training and certification are two vehicles the NIAAA has developed to help athletic administrators meet those challenges within the local school and community. The purpose of leadership training is to present best practices in use today that will better prepare athletic directors.

Athletic administrators are encouraged to participate in the NIAAA Leadership Training Institute (LTI) either at the state or national level. They are further encouraged to obtain their certification as an RAA, RMSAA, CAA or CMAA.

There are 51 courses available to take. These are broken down into three sections. Foundation courses (500 classes) provide a base of knowledge and skill that serves as a platform for conducting educationally sound extracurricular activities. Operations and management courses (600 classes) provide skills, knowledge and best practices that enhance administrator efficiency and effectiveness in the management and operation of extra-curricular activities. Leadership courses (700 classes) provide knowledge and skills that will facilitate development of new visions, creative strategies and innovative practices for educationally sound extra-curricular activities.

Each year the IAAA tries to offer one class from each level at the state conference. Instructors are either local or national presenters. This year the IAAA will be offering these classes at our state conference. 706 Coaching Coaches to be Leadership Educators. 502 Athletic Administration: Strategies for Organization Management. 715 Athletic Administration: Appropriate Professional Boundaries. Additionally, courses may be taken at the National Conference or through the NIAAA via webinars or online classes.


